
A MESSAGE FROM THE LIBRARY DIRECTOR

It's back to school time...and time to get something back too! September is I LOVE MY LISLE LIBRARY CARD month. This community-wide promotion affords LLD patrons even more Library card value by providing discounts at numerous local businesses and non-profits. Patron Spotlight: Emily Mao

School buses are reappearing on streets, kids are carrying lunchboxes, and students are once again prepping for exams. This month, we're highlighting LLD patron Emily Mao, who was recently able to achieve the rare test-taking feat of a perfect score of 36 on the ACT.

Emily attributes much of her school success to a childhood spent at the Library. Emily is a self-described 'bookworm' who got her first card at age three and sometimes even got yelled at for refusing to put books down. Emily says that her reading habit gave her an early advantage over other students, which she was able to maintain and build over her school career. When she visited the Library, she rarely had a specific book in mind. Instead, she would walk through the shelves, looking through all the options before deciding on what to borrow.

When asked how she sees the future of the Library, Emily says that "There's been a lot of talk about being more digital. I think it's a good idea to expand it, but I'm the person who likes having physical books with me, and turning the pages." She goes on to say that the way she and her peers interact with books and the Library doesn't always fit what other people expect, and it's always changing.




