

#### ReDiscover: Home Decor Accessory Swap



# Volunteer as a Tutor with Literacy DuPage!

After "graduation" on May 12, new tutors will be matched with a student. Tutoring can take place in the Library's Literacy/English Language Development (ELD) room using materials in the Library's collection.






