

## LLD Butterfly Garden



Monarch populations have been rapidly declining throughout North America for a variety of reasons, including the disappearance of milkweed plants.

Milkweed is the sole food source for Monarch caterpillars; without it, Monarchs cannot exist. *The Illinois Department of Natural Resources* and the U.S. Department of Fish and Wildlife Service's Partners for Fish and Wildlife recently sent the Library a packet of milkweed seeds to begin a butterfly garden! The LLD Butterfly Garden will be located next to the parking lot entrance on Kingston Avenue.
