



Message from the Director:

I'd like to thank the residents who came to the LLD's first capital project Open House on June 9th. The LLD has planned for three community open houses so patrons can learn about and participate in the Library's upcoming renovation. The first Open House introduced patrons to the *concept design* floorplans and discussed funding for the project. Patrons listened to a brief presentation and then were invited to visit an array of image boards in the room and talk to the architects, staff, and Trustees about various features on each board.

Takeaways from the first Open House included support for expanding Youth Services, having dual entrances stemming from the center of the building (north/south), the addition of family restrooms, ensuring the LLD maintains a robust collection of materials, and optimizing access for all patrons.

At LLD Open House #2, expect to see floor plan updates, 3D views of the planned interior improvements and potential exterior enhancements. We hope to see even more residents at the next event!
