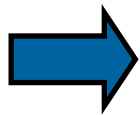

Access Steps:

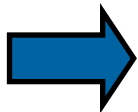
From Your Computer:

Go to: www.lislelibrary.org/LLDdatabases

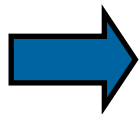


Select "Chicago Tribune Online." Enter your library card number and PIN. Click "Login." Create a login for 72 hour access or browse anonymously for 24 hour access. When the access runs out, go back to the Library's website to extend it.

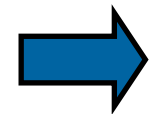
GETTING STARTED:



The home page opens to the digital editions that appear the same as in the print format. Today's edition is on the left. Click on the sections for "All Editions," "Evening Editions," "Daily Southtown," "Lake County News Sun," "Naperville Sun," and others suburban Tribune papers.



Browse the digital edition at both the page and article levels. Use the right arrows to advance the pages. Can download individual pages, share articles via social media, email, or a direct link to a page or article, and zoom in and out of pages, and re-size text.



Click on the Headphones icon on an article page to listen to the content.

Optional Step: Sign in with your Chicago Tribune account via Google, Apple, Facebook or create an account using your email. Enjoy access on all devices for three days, and enable more site features.
